



Presidents pick

Some of the biggest names in world golf, including Masters champion Angel Cabrera from Argentina, are set to wear Galvin Green rain-wear when they compete against the Americans in the Presidents Cup match in San Francisco this October (8-11).

Australian Greg Norman, the new captain of the Internationals team who has taken over from South African legend Gary Player, invited Galvin's Canadian licensee Jonathan Wong to bid to equip a team that could also include South Africans Ernie Els, Retief Goosen, Tim Clark and Rory Sabbatini, plus Vijay Singh (Fiji), Geoff Ogilvy (Australia), Jeev M Singh (India), Camilo Villegas (Columbia), K. J. Choi (S. Korea) and Mike Weir (Canada).

"After seeing the impact that the Presidents Cup made when it was played in Montreal in 2007, I knew this was an opportunity not to be missed," said Jonathan. "There is no doubt that Norman and his team would prefer to wear Galvin Green,

especially as the event will be played for the first time on the west coast of the US where the weather can turn nasty. The Internationals have only won one of the previous seven Cup events (in Melbourne in 1998), so we hope they play well enough to win this time."

The event is played in non-Ryder Cup years and features leading players from outside Europe against a strong US team captained by Fred Couples.
